## **Notes and Frequently Asked Questions**

#### Summer School

#### Q. What if I plan on taking a course in summer school?

A. Please select the potential summer school course in Xello in case your plans change. When you request registration for a summer school course , you will be asked to indicate the course you wish to replace it with in your schedule.

#### **Missed Compulsories**

#### Q: What if I still need a compulsory course from grade 9?

A: Make a note of the course you need from grade 9 in the "notes" section and choose this course in XELLO along with the grade 10 level course if you wish to take it next year. In this case, you will have one less elective

# Q: What is required to earn a French Immersion Certificate? How do I check that I am on track to earn a certificate?

A: If you are working toward a French Immersion Certificate, be sure to:

- select "FIF2D" as one of your elective courses.
- If you wish to take a course in French, be sure to select the course code that ends in "F" for that class.
- You have the choice as to which courses you take in French, but there will be fewer options in grades 11 and 12. If you choose not to take all the French courses available to you in 10, we would

encourage you to map out a plan in XELLO to make sure you earn the required number (4 French + 6 others taught in the French language) by the end of grade 12.

# Q. I would like to take a grade 11 course next year when I am in grade 10. Can I choose a grade 11 course in Xello?

A. Students are encouraged to choose grade appropriate courses to minimize scheduling conflicts and to ensure they are prepared for expectations of the next grade level. Note that our priority is to make sure that students have what they need to meet graduation requirements. If you choose a grade 11 course, you may not be able to keep your spot in the course if a grade 11 student needs it. If that happens, you will need to choose another course and your options at that time may be very limited due to timetable constraints.
