Notes and Frequently Asked Questions

Summer School

Q. What if I plan on taking a course in summer school?

A. Please select the potential summer school course in Xello in case your plans change. When you request registration for a summer school course , you will be asked to indicate the course you wish to replace it with in your schedule. Once you have completed the course, we will receive notification of this and attempt to schedule in this course or an alternate.

French Immersion Certificate

Q: What is required to earn a French Immersion Certificate? How do I check that I am on track to earn a certificate? A: If you are working toward a French Immersion Certificate, be sure to:

- select "FIF3U" as one of your elective courses.
- If you wish to take a course in French, be sure to select the course code that ends in "F" for that class.

Missed Compulsories

Q: What if I still need a compulsory course from grade 10?

A: Make a note of the course you need from grade 10 in the right hand column (under "notes") and choose this course in XELLO along with the grade 11 level course if you wish to take it next year. In this case, you will have one less elective.

Reaching Ahead

Q. I would like to take a grade 12 course next year when I am in grade 11. Can I choose a grade 12 course in Xello?

A. Students are encouraged to choose grade appropriate courses to minimize scheduling conflicts and to ensure they are prepared for expectations of the next grade level. Note that our priority is to make sure that students have what they need to meet graduation requirements. If you choose a grade 12 course, you may not be able to keep your spot in the course if a grade 12 student needs it. If that happens, you will need to choose another course and your options at that time may be very limited due to timetable constraints.

eLearning Requirement

Q. The Ministry of Education has instituted an eLearning Graduation Requirement for students. What if eLearning is not a good fit for my learning profile?

If your child would like to opt-out of this requirement, you can do so <u>using this</u> form. Please note, current grade 11 students will receive one eLearning credit due to their experiences with pandemic learning, and current grade 12 students are exempted from the requirement and do **not** need to complete the opt-out form.
